The 8,500 names on the stone tablets that make up the monument are both a reminder and an invitation.

Reminder: The horrific extermination of Jews. Appeal: This must never be forgotten and Never happen again.

The names on the monument are murdered Relatives of those who survived and came to Sweden.



The monument is characterized, in the same way as Jewish burial places, by the greatest simplicity.

The starting point for the design of the monument was a dignified, secluded place on Jewish land for remembrance and reflection. The location next to the synagogue gives the memory of the deceased a natural home.

The extension in Aaron Isaac's alley and the opening towards Raoul Wallenberg's square forms a bridge between the Jewish and the Swedish.

The large post-war group included about 10,000 concentration camp survivors, most of them without families and sick from severe hardships. The survivors who came to Sweden were convinced that the peace concluded in May 1945 would prevail forever and that the defeat of Nazism would mean the end of all racist movements in the future.

It didn't happen that way, and as a result the Association of Holocaust Survivors was founded, which took as its most important task to work against Nazism and the denial of the Holocaust. The idea of erecting a name monument was presented in the spring of 1994.

The memorial to the victims of the Holocaust was designed by sculptor Sivert Lindblom and architect Gabriel Herdevall. The monument was inaugurated in 1998 by King Carl XVI Gustav.

This month, we will be hosting Sisterhood Shabbat, starting with a delicious Shabbat dinner.

Shalom Temple Beth David friends,

Welcome to the new secular year of 2023.

As we come to the end of the winter holiday season, you might think that our celebrations are over... BUT WAIT there's always something more to celebrate!

As usual, I will be with the Temple Beth David



community for two Shabbatot in January: January 13-14 and January 27-28, and we have special programming on the calendar for each of those weekends.

Please join me on **Friday evening, January 13** when Kabbalat Shabbat will begin at **7pm** (*note the time change!*) and is designed as an intergenerational service that includes our Religious School students. This creative and interactive evening will be instrumental to bringing in and celebrating Shabbat together. I hope you will be there.

Another wonderful Shabbat event will take place on **Friday, January 27** as we celebrate Sisterhood Shabbat. It promises to be a beautiful evening of community as the women of our Temple lead the service.

Also in January, we begin reading the second Book of the Torah, Shemot (Exodus). In this next section of the Torah narrative, we meet Moshe (Moses), we see the hardships that the Pharaoh inflicts upon the Children of Israel, and we experience the beginning of the freedom journey from Egypt to the Promised Land.

Our Jewish scholars have pointed out that the transition between the book of Bereishit (Genesis) and the book of Shemot (Exodus) can also be perceived as the transition between being individuals or family units into becoming a nation.

So much of what defines us as the B'nai Yisrael (the children of Israel) can be found in this book of the Torah. There is much to learn in the stories of the Divine choosing Moses as a leader, the way we see the siblings; Moses, Aaron and Miriam transition into their roles in guiding the Israelites, and how these narratives clearly show the very human traits of both bravery and fear, as well as blind faith. During what was a difficult and unsettling time in our history, our ancestors grew into a holy people.

This month, we too, are gifted with opportunities to gather together as a nation, a holy people, in support of Jewish leadership in our own Temple family.

I truly hope to see you in-person at each of our special Shabbat services.

Wishing you good health, happiness and unexpected blessings in 2023.

The following is a summary of the December Board meeting, which took place on December 21st.

- The President, in her remarks noted that communication and teamwork need to be improved to keep TBD strong. As such, Rabbi Tashman has been asked and has agreed, to put together a Leadership training. This will take place in January, most likely January 15. The chair of Fundraising spoke and reaffirmed the President's remarks.
- The Bazaar and Thanksgiving were both financial successes.
- During the Treasurer's report, it was brought out that dues collections so far this year are about \$6000 less than last year, due mainly to members passing on. We need to make a concerted effort to add new members to avoid a shortfall. Bryan and Barbara Blavatt are once again funding the cost of the High Holiday cantor for next year through the Muriel Feldman Fund. This may be the last year we can expect this donation; if so, we will need to find replacement funding.

The Budget & Finance chair requested that Committee Chairs get their funding requests for next year's budget in by January 23.

- Funds were moved from several unused budget items to cover Security and Technology.
- The asking price for the lot donated to the Temple was once again reduced.
- Future upcoming events include Rosh Chodesh, Sisterhood Shabbat Dinner and Service, Kids/Family night dinner and Service.
- Attendance at services was discussed. Members need to make an increased effort to come to Friday night and Saturday services. The Temple is working on ways to make coming to services more inviting.
- A Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday, February 5 at noon; lunch will be served.
- A Leadership Training on Sunday January 15 was announced.
- New members Judith Shane and Darlene Bell were approved.
- Everyone was reminded about donating to our Hanukkah Gelt drive. The money will go towards paying off our mortgage, thereby freeing up funds to pay a full-time Rabbi.




