THE PRESIDENT WOULD LIKE TO SAY A FEW WORDS...

As we enter the High Holy Days, this is the perfect time to pause and ponder where we individually missed the mark last year and what we need to do to change that. As a *kehillah kedosha, a Holy Congregation,* it is also the perfect opportunity to examine what we could have done better and to devise a plan to do better in 5784.

Were we welcoming to strangers- prospective members, new members, those visiting for the first time? Did we take the time to engage them, try to get to know a little about them, direct them to others whose company they might enjoy? Or did we continue our conversations with friends, simply smiling at



someone new, without taking that extra step to make them feel welcome? Let's each make that small extra effort to be more welcoming; what a difference that could make to our *shul* culture!

Did we meet the needs of all of our members? TBD prides itself in having many activities throughout the year. However, there may be programs that **you** or another member or prospective member would like to see. Please let Rabbi Jen or me, or someone on the Board, know directly, what you need or want so that we can make it happen. Whether you are ill and need a ride to a doctor, would like to see something different in the service, want to suggest an Adult Ed course on something you are interested in, or want to plan a mah jongg game at TBD, call or email so we can be responsive.

Did we engage in lashon hara? Nothing is more destructive to *shul* culture than *lashon hara*, the evil tongue. When you find yourself starting to speak ill of someone, **even if it's the truth**, resist the urge! If you are the one hearing the evil talk (gossip) stop the person in mid-sentence and tell them that you are not interested in hearing that kind of talk. If you have a problem with someone, go directly to the person and communicate directly with them instead of talking behind their back.

Were we supportive of the Jewish Community? If you are reading this as a non-member or a former member, please consider what it would be like if there were no synagogue in the Nature Coast, no Rabbi to call for lifecycle events, no Jewish Food Fest to enjoy your favorite foods, no homemade challah to buy for Shabbat. Judaism can only survive with community support. Visit us this Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur (no charge for tickets) and experience the joy of being with your fellow Jews. In a primarily non-Jewish area such as this, your support is particularly crucial; be a part of something uplifting and great in the New Year!

<u>A message from the Rabbí.</u>

September, 2023 Kvetching.

Kvetch literally means "squeeze" in Yiddish, and commonly refers to *whining* or *complaining*. In Yiddish, *kvetch* still retains its original meaning of pressing or applying pressure. So, to push a button is to *kvetch ah knepel*, and when a person is emotionally squeezed, small minded or otherwise suppressed, he or she is *farkvetched*.



People have been kvetching for thousands of years! The Israelites complain throughout their 40 year journey in the wilderness to the promised land. Rabbis and scholars have explained that these parts of the Tanakh emphasize that it is normal or common for people to complain, but a person of faith, rather than kvetching, places their trust in God.

Kvetching will never cease; as long as desire exists, so will disappointment. While certainly everyone kvetches or complains, it is not the Jewish ideal. We read in the Mishnah that the truly wealthy person is the one who is content with their lot, not one who complains about its shortcomings. So how do we curb our kvetching?

In 2014, Robin Kowalski, a psychology professor at Clemson University, and her colleagues published a research study about how happy people complain. From their conclusions, they recommend complaining with a purpose by expressing complaints in a more deliberate way, so you can work through problems more productively.

We are in the month of Elul, an introspective time for many. We are headed into the *Yamim Noraim*, Days of Awe or High HolyDays. During this time of repentance, return, and renewal, we have a powerful opportunity to reflect and to be thankful for our divine blessings that surround us. We can take the time to reflect on more deliberate, productive ways of kvetching.

We certainly don't want to keep our frustrations bottled up and we need to complain at times; however, there is a time and place. But we can reflect first, considering whether the kvetching will help you vent or provide a space for advice on addressing the problem. Synagogue is a sacred space for reflection, prayer and community. A perfect opportunity to step away from the kvetching and instead focus on spirituality and community - connecting with a Divine power and helping **all** feel welcome in this space and in the Temple Beth David community.


Scroll of Remembrance


