Lag BaOmer at TBD!

Marlene Shaw told the story behind Lag BaOmer, which was followed by the members singing some celebrating tunes, accompanied by Jill Pfluke, violin, and Karen Moore on flute. The celebration continued with burning the formal TBD mortgage, which finally, had been paid of a few weeks ago. As a final, some marshmallows were toasted over the warm fire.





Why Do We Celebrate Lag BaOmer?

The Biblical source for counting the Omer period is Leviticus 23: 15-16.

"You shall count from the eve of the second day of Pesach, when an omer of grain is to be brought as an offering, seven complete weeks. The day after the seventh week of your counting will make fifty days, and you shall present a new meal offering to God."

The word Omer literally means sheaf, and, as you can see from the verse, refers to the offering of grain brought on the second day of Passover.

Agriculturally, the Omer period tracks the harvest from the beginning of the early barley harvest to the

end of the later wheat harvest. Likewise, it also significantly tracks the blossoming of the Jewish people from the exodus from Egypt to the giving of the Torah on Har Sinai.

Since Lag BaOmer is a minor Jewish holiday, work and day-to-day activity is still permissible. That said, Jewish communities around the world celebrate Lag BaOmer with many distinct and special traditions. Chief among these is the lighting of bonfires, which makes Lag BaOmer an especially exciting and beloved holiday for Jewish children.

\mathcal{D} ear Chaí Líghts Newsletter reader,

When I am planning for the cover page for each Chai Lights Newsletter, I'm looking for an interesting Jewish or Israeli holiday, during the upcoming month in question.

Most of the months, this is working fine, but for the June issue, it seemed like the Divine Holiday Planning Department decided to go on vacation.

No holiday during June. Nada. No. Njet.

Well, there has been at least one holiday each month, starting with January – The International Holocaust Remembrance Day. In February, we had Tu'Bishvat, in March, there was Purim, in April we enjoyed the Seder during Pesach, and in May we celebrated Shavuot.

Maybe I just should humbly accept, that there is, at least, one month, where we have a chance to mentally recharge, before the autumn starts up, with the high holidays.

So let me present a somewhat off topic holiday, since we lack a suitable holiday, this

month –

The Swedish Midsummer Eve.

I hear you. "- Swedish Mid... what?"

And why on the "Eve"?

Well, Scandinavians celebrate the major holidays on the Eve, before the holiday in question. The reason is the ancient Nordic tradition to count the start of the next day, on the evening, and not at midnight.



Well, as you maybe know by now, your humble editor lives in the outskirts of the very northern part of Europe, at the same latitude as Anchorage, Alaska.

And then, I'm living in the eastern part of middle Sweden. The very southern part of Sweden is at the same latitude as Manitoba, Canada. The very northern part of Sweden is at the same latitudes as the northern coasts of Alaska.

As you now understand, the nature is somewhat different up here, compared with

Florida. According to me as a Swede, you guys have summer, all around the year.

We do have seasons, over here, and I love the way they change the nature, over the year.

When I state "seasons" above, I really mean "Seasons" - with a big "S."

Real seasons. Real winter – snow, ice cold temperatures, but also sunny days. Spring and autumn, meaning rain, winds, and sometimes, if you are lucky, sunny, but with cold nights.

Summer - sunny, warm days, and then a few days of rain, and then sunny weather, again.

However, up north in Sweden, they have a saying: "Eleven months of winter, and one month of summer." Guess why...

Now you might get a feeling of the importance of the summer, in this country.

Swedes are living in darkness with either rainy or snowy weather most of the time, and then we have a few months of warm weather, when the nature awakes, and everything has to happen, within one or a few months.



When the weekends are dominated by sunny and warm days, you see people suddenly start to smile and laugh, sit at tables outside the cafés, something which was totally impossible just a few months ago, and shorts, t-shirts and blouses are becoming the dress code of the day.

It is hardly that strange that the Swedes love the short summer period.

We have had a national holiday for some years, but if you ask any Swede which day they really consider to be their real Day of Independence, most Swedes will respond "Midsummer Eve." "So, what is Midsummer?

Midsummer is, from the beginning, a harvest celebration, similar to our Jewish Sukkot. However, when we celebrate Sukkot, the nature in Sweden is already on it's way to enter hibernation.

The harvest period for the crops between June and August, is far gone.

Midsummer is a pre-Christian tradition centered around the summer solstice. The Celts, Vikings, and other ancient peoples across Europe celebrated light reigning over darkness, as well as fertility and the blooming of summer, with bonfires, feasts, and dancing.



Midsummer Eve is celebrated across Scandinavia. While good weather is never guaranteed, a long, light evening is, thanks to the midnight sun. Outdoor celebrations including maypole dancing and seafood buffets are enjoyed in Sweden, while bonfires are a common sight throughout Denmark and Norway.

Historically, in peasant society, Midsummer marked a turning point in the working year, while Midsummer Night itself was considered full of magical powers and supernatural beings

By the way, since it is the longest day of the year, Shabbat in Stockholm starts at 09:51pm, and ends on June 25th, 12:50am...

So, in case you remember this small contribution, at the Shabbat starting June 23rd, get some pickled herring, some salmon, why not some gefilte fish, some kosher meatballs, potatoes, and a nice salad, and enjoy the desert of a strawberry cake. Since the Midsummer eve nowadays always is on a Friday, it is not totally wrong for a jew over here, to call it the "Midsummer Shabbat."
