The President would like to say a few words...

Nisan is the first month of the Jewish calendar (surprisingly not Tishri). Therefore, it seems the perfect time to reflect on the past year or two. The pandemic began in the US in March 2020, causing a change in the daily routine of everyone in the country (and world), not the least at Temple Beth David.

When I became President, we had many challenges: how to conduct meaningful services that our congregants would enjoy, how to keep a feeling of togetherness and inclusion, when we really could not physically get together much? Also problematic: would people actually pay dues when they could not be at TBD physically? How to run a Religious School when the children could not gather in person? Combine that with a change in rabbinic services requiring us to have guest and lay Rabbis on Friday nights. Through strong leadership and team efforts of our Board and active committees, we not only survived, we thrived. I asked the Caring Committee to start to reach out, through regular phone calls and cards to every single congregant, so that our members would know that they were not going through this difficult period alone. Zoom services and classes were offered (and still are), so that we **never** missed a Shabbat or holiday service. Outdoor events were held whenever possible, allowing people who were able, to gather in person. Our caring teachers and Principal held Religious School on Zoom each week, most learning how to use this platform for the first time. Fundraisers continued to be held, albeit in a modified way. While many Congregations offered very little during the height of the pandemic, TBD had a full schedule. We attracted new members during this period and through today. In fact, though we lost many long time members to death and relocation, our membership has remained stable, and new (and returning) members are still joining.

As the world has opened up, so too, has TBD been able to enjoy some form of normalcy this year. Our Fundraising Committee, with the help of many, many volunteers, has brought in record amounts. Our 26th Annual Food Fest, has just concluded its most successful year. Our building is in great condition, with a new roof, fresh exterior paint, refurbished Rabbi's study and office and new chairs coming soon. (cont'd on next page)

Members and friends of TBD have been most generous in funding much of these renovations, thus not depleting our Capital Fund. We have been able to bring BNI, a networking group, back on a weekly basis, bringing revenue in to defray some costs. We have also negotiated a long-term lease with a cell-tower company, which, once it is constructed, will bring an additional \$1000 per month into our coffers. Savings have been made on our insurance, telephone services and wherever we reasonably could find savings. Our proposed budget will show a surplus.

I would like to offer my greatest thanks to our Leadership team: the Executive Board and each and every member of our Board of Directors. It really does take a village: it is only through unity of purpose and putting TBD's interests above personal opinions or ego trips that we could have accomplished the results we have attained during the past two years. Even more importantly, I am proud to be a member of this warm and caring family we call Temple Beth David. Your willingness to pitch in, **each and every one of you.** to the best of your abilities, through time, money and effort, has allowed our Congregation to overcome every obstacle and remain strong.

On April 24th we will be holding our Congregational meeting, at which time we will be electing Officers and Board members for the coming two years. I would like to remain your President for the next two years, since I feel have some important unfinished business to accomplish. For TBD to survive and thrive into the future, we need to focus on developing our school, youth programs and identifying younger families to join us. We have made a start: This year our School has adopted a new curriculum call ShalomLearning, a wonderful program teaching Jewish content through Jewish values. We have planned, for this summer a long-held dream of mine - a week-long summer camp. I would like the Temple to work with the Federation to help us identify younger families and improve our utilization of our database. We have the very tiny beginnings of a teen youth program, which Rabbi Emanuel want to develop. If you feel, as I do, that we are headed in a good direction and would like to see that continue and grow, please vote to reelect me as your President on April 24.

First and foremost, a big Thank You to all the volunteers that organized the Food Fest mega-event and all the worker bees that made it happen. Your work, enthusiasm and dedication turned it into being such a success, both in its financial contribution to the wellbeing of TBD and in enhancing the relationship with the larger community, that we are part of.



As we continue to keep the ongoing war in Ukraine in our front and center attention, we add to our prayers for peace in the region actions and "sacrifices" that will help the prayers:

- In addition to monetary donations, we launched Operation "Spring-Pesach Cleanup" during which we will collect and deliver household items to help those refugees that eventually will arrive here soon to settle in and start a little more manageable life in our midst. Please find details within the Chai-Lights publication.

And there is more, a lot more:

- An exciting and inspiring presentation by Moti Tikotinsky, a member of the Raki-ah Experiments Management Team the second scientific space program that Israel conducts. He just participated in the launch of the Raki-ah Mission and took a day to visit and share with us some of the less known inside stories about this program and the SpaceIL Bereshit Program that launched a lunar vehicle to the moon.
- In parallel to Operation "Spring-Pesach Cleanup" we will do a symbolic koshering of the kitchen and the Temple with the Religious School. All are invited to enjoy and savor the tradition and the way our ancestors (my parents and I as a kid included...) did it. Details will be published in the Weekly Wrap and special announcements.
- To supplement the former activity, we will be offering to sell your personal Ḥametz, so your home will also be Kosher for Pesach. Forms will be distributed to all interested members and friends, as we get closer to Pesah.
- The Seder this year will hopefully incorporate some of your own personal stories of "Y'tzi-at Mitzrayim" getting out of the narrow straits into freedom. Those of you who have a story to share during the Seder please contact me.
- And after Pesach we will commemorate yet another major "Y'tzi-at Mitzrayim" of our People, as we observe the remembrance of Yom HaShoah.

The conclusion of the Seder is the wish-blessing: "L'Shanah HaBa-ah B'Yerushalayim – Next year in Jerusalem." Are you interested in making this wish come true? Let me know! if a critical mass of you will express interest, we can start working on making it happen and figure out what it takes as we plan this exciting experience.








Starting at 10am, all in presence at Temple Beth David then – Religious School students and their parents, congregants and friends – will start baking Kosher Matzoth for Pesach.

Time is of essence: you have only eighteen minutes from start, when water touches the flour, to finish, putting the Matza in the oven. So please, bring your aprons and rolling pins and join the fun!

After backing matzoth, we will Kasher a few dishes in boiling water, search for Ḥametz crums and burn our findings. Then we will be able to declare Temple Beth David as Kosher for Passover of 5782, ready for the Seder on Friday the 15th of April.

PREPARATION FOR PESACH – DELEGATION OF POWER FOR SALE OF HAMETZ

This year we will sell the Ḥametz of those who are interested in doing it in a consolidated form having the Rabbi acting as our agent.

The form, attached on the next page, authorizes the Rabbi to act on behalf of each individual that is interested in selling one's



Ḥametz. To do so, one must fill out all the empty fields that are in the form, sign it and deposit the sum that one decides is needed to purchase the Ḥametz after the Pesach.

Rabbi Emanuel will publish the contract he will be making on the congregation's behalf for the sale of the Ḥametz of the community in due time.

All those who intend to sell their Ḥametz, should segregate and put aside the Ḥametz known to them and designated it "for sale."

The time the sale of the Ḥametz will come into effect is Friday the 15th of April, at 11:30am. As of that time, any of the Ḥametz that may be at the premises designated in the authorization form is the property of the Buyer, with all that is a derivative of that possession.

All forms must be submitted to the office no later than Thursday the 14th of April at noon.

PREPARATION FOR PESACH – DELEGATION OF POWER FOR SALE OF HAMETZ

I, the undersigned, fully empower and permit Rabbi Emanuel Ben-David to act in my place and stead, and on my behalf to sell all Ḥametz possessed by me, knowingly or unknowingly as defined by the Torah and Rabbinic Law (e.g. Ḥametz, possible Ḥametz, and all kinds of Ḥametz mixtures).

Also, Ḥametz that tends to harden and adhere to inside surfaces of pans, pots, or cooking utensils, the utensils themselves, and all kinds of live animals and pets that have been eating Ḥametz and mixtures thereof.

Rabbi Emanuel Ben-David is also empowered to lease all places wherein the Ḥametz owned by me may be found, particularly at the address/es listed below, and elsewhere.

Rabbi Emanuel Ben-David has full right to appoint any agent or substitute in his stead and said substitute shall have full right to sell and lease as provided herein.

Rabbi Emanuel Ben-David also has the full power and right to act as he deems fit and proper in accordance with all the details of the Bill of Sale used in the transaction to sell all my Ḥametz, Ḥametz mixtures, etc., as provided herein.

This power is in conformity with all Torah, Rabbinic and Civil laws.





The always eminent and knowledgeable religious teacher Lynn Budnick succeeded to hide behind a perfect costume, even fooling your editor.






Dear reader,

In this edition of the Chai Lights Newsletter there are a flyer for the first, most exciting, upcoming Jewish summer camp, Camp Chesed, now in planning by Temple Beth David, a dream which has been in the mind of people within Temple Beth David, for a very long time.

If you are a parent and don't have any experience of a Jewish summer camp and why it is recommended for your child's Jewish learning and self identity, I just want to mention my own experience from my participation in the Jewish summer camp.

As you maybe already know, I'm not an American.

I'm living in Stockholm, Sweden, born Swedish as well as Jewish, being a 2nd generation with my mother, surviving the Holocaust, and just another snowbird, though not from the north of this continent, but I have to take a slightly longer path from the northeast, from the Scandinavian peninsula, to get to Spring Hill, and I do it a few times, every year, to avoid the winter weather and icy roads.

Well, when I got the word that this summer camp was in planning by Temple Beth David, I wanted to share my own experiences, of my own participation of a Jewish summer camp.

So here it is.

Back home, we have a Jewish summer camp, situated in the northern archipelago of Stockholm. That camp has been fostering



Jewish kids for decades, since the early Peeling potatoes, sometime back around 1910's

beginning of the 20th century.

My father, who was born 1906, went to that camp, several times.

I went to the camp as well, and my kids have been to that camp, both as participating kids, and one of them, as a leader.

The Swedish Jewry is a very small minority, within the Swedish population.

The number of Swedes is roughly ten million, and the number of Jews is between 15 000 – 20 000, with a third of those, being members of any

congregation.

The country is more than three times larger than Florida but with one-third the Floridian population, meaning the Swedish population is spread out into small villages, towns, and cities. There are only four Jewish congregations in the country.

That means that as a kid, you are probably alone in your school, being Jewish. If you know any other Jewish kid, you are either living in a larger city, or you are in luck.

Since many families are not religious, there might be an issue with getting to know your background and the Jewish

traditions, if you don't have parents, not following the traditions, or don't have the knowledge or interest to do so.

A Jewish camp is a starter for your child and will give your child a vitalized ego image of his or hers Jewish heritage. It will give your child the initial tools to manage antisemitic arguments and most important of all - it will give the kid new Jewish friends, maybe for life.
