We have been waiting to have a Congregational meeting until the Rabbi arrived. We will hold our February meeting on Monday February 28 at 7:30 pm. The meeting will be held in person and on Zoom. Be sure to attend to find out the latest Temple plans and also to give your input.

Last, but definitely not least, we need members who are willing to step up to leadership positions in the coming year. Temple Beth David functions almost completely through the hard work of our volunteers. To remain strong, new people must take the reins from those who have done so much in the past. A message from the Rabbí

Shalom, dear members and friends of Temple Beth David,

This is my first contribution to the Chai-Lights Newsletter, and for that it deserves the special blessing we recite whenever we experience something new, the Sheheheyanu blessing. On one

hand I am excited to be here and on the other hand I face with awe what it takes to be your Rabbi, teacher and spiritual leader.

Your warm welcoming and hospitality wrap me with a blanket of love, and I am grateful to you for that. I pray to HaShem that He will grant me success on the journey upon which I am about to embark with you: strengthening your Jewish identity and affiliation with Am Yisrael – the People of Israel.

There are several avenues that are part of this journey. Participating in services is one of them, not the only one. And it was heartwarming to see so many of you – both in-person and on Zoom from close and afar – joining us these last two Shabbatot.

Another avenue that I intend to widen is the avenue of study. We have started with a weekly Torah study, in which we delve into the weekly Parasha, just before Shabbat morning service. The first session was exciting, with many very active participants. As of the second week of February we will have two more classes, both in-person and on Zoom. The first will be held every Monday, titled "Jewish Thought". The second series will be on every second and forth Thursdays, titled "It's about Israel". And we will also try to engage the teens in a program that will be tailored to meet their areas of interest.

In the "Jewish Thought" series we will explore many subjects: Halakha (Jewish Law), Talmud, Holidays, history and spirituality. We will also address some of the subjects that you, the participants, will be interested in. In the "It's about Israel" program we will start with creating and agreeing to some ground rules that will enable all participants to feel safe in expressing their wide spectrum of difference opinions. We will then review the history of Zionism and the State of Israel, we will watch movies and discuss the lessons learned from them, and even tackle the "hot potato" called the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.

Another avenue, not less important, is the performance of Hesed – acts of lovingkindness. It starts with charity – to our congregation, and to the other needs of the larger community. Being involved in the Temple's activities and help running it is yet another way to engage. It goes on with the list of acts that we read in our morning prayer of which hospitality, caring for the sick and tending to the dead are a few cornerstones.

I am here for you and available to respond to you. My door is (almost always) open. You can always find me through the Temple Beth David office.

Mel Greene Institute to Combat Human Trafficking formed

Saint Leo University and the Pasco Sheriff's Office have jointly created the Mel Greene Institute to Combat Human Trafficking. Saint Leo University and a Pasco Sheriff's Office agency (called Florida Forensic Institute for Research, Security and Tactics or F1RST) named the institute for the late Spring Hill resident and philanthropist Melvin T. "Mel" Greene. Greene passed away in 2020 at the age of 92 after a life spent helping


Sisterhood Shabbat




<u>SHABBAT SERVICE REMINDER</u> SAFETY UPDATE !







