THE PRESIDENT WOULD LIKE TO SAY A FEW WORDS...

A few days ago, we began the Hebrew month of Kislev. It contains the winter solstice- the day of the longest span of physical darkness, followed by the day in which the light begins to grow longer and marking the physical/ seasonal reality of the returning of light after the longest and darkest night. The mystics teach us that whatever is occurring outside of us is also occurring inside of us.

For me, personally, with the sudden loss of my beloved partner, Jim, I begin Kislev at a point of peak darkness. However, I trust and pray that light is beginning to creep back in and will continue to strengthen. This, I believe, is due to the love, support and compassion of my family, not only my biological family, but also my Temple family.



I am eternally grateful for the calls, texts, cards, visits and donations from so many TBD "sisters" and "brothers". I hope and pray that this reflected light and love from those around me will spark my internal light to rise from the darkness.

Kislev has a very special meaning "**Kis**" means "**pocket**" and "**lev**" means "**heart**". Within the pocket of each person's heart is the light and energy needed to spark another's light when it has dimmed and sputtered due to grief, illness or depression. Use the light in the pocket of your heart to brighten another's day. Call, email or text just to let them know you care and are thinking about them. It may make a world of difference to them.

Within the month of Kislev is Chanukah, the Festival of Lights. This, of course, is no accident. May the beauty of the Chanukah lights shine within each of us, keeping Judaism and each other, alive.

I hope to see you all at the Night of 100 Menorahs on December 18.

A message from the Rabbi

December 2022

Shalom, Temple Beth David friends,

As the end of November came into sight, we welcomed in the Hebrew month of Kislev.

The month of Kislev brings us to the Festival of

Chanukah, a holiday of joy and a holiday where we celebrate miracles. Chanukah originated with the miraculous victory that the Maccabees experienced in overcoming the Greeks, along with the remarkable blessing of the oil that provided light lasting for eight days. This month also brings us into a season of darkness. It comes as no surprise that at this time of year, each year we intentionally focus on the light.

So, what does that mean to focus on the light? We light the candles on our menorahs each night for eight nights. There is also a practice of putting our menorahs into the windows so that the light can be seen by others. Does this lead us to believe that we are to bring light into this world, and respond to the needs of others? I believe it does. I believe as a part of tikkun olam, helping to repair the world, we have a role in bringing light to one another.

When we look at our own chanukiyot (menorahs), we see holders for eight candles, one holder representing each night of the holiday. In addition to those eight nights, there is one special candle holder for the Shamash. And what is the Shamash? The Shamash is the candle that helps to bring the flames of the other candles to life.

So my question is, how do we each become a Shamash in this world to light the flame for other people? To bring the light into the darkness, whether it is darkness of the season, or a darkness that represents difficult times, a sense of isolation, despair, or desperation.

There are so many people who are in need of the most basic of items. I'd like to ask you to consider a donation of paper goods so that as a holy community, we can offer light to those in need.

Starting now, please bring your paper goods donations of *toilet paper, paper towels, and tissues* to Temple Beth David up through, Sunday, December 18, our Night of 100 Menorahs.

This year for Chanukah, please join me in being the Shamash to others in our community. With your help, together we can fill the shelves at Gulf Coast Jewish Family and Community Services for distribution to those in need.

Anyone who has ever visited the TBD office or attended a TBD activity has had the opportunity and pleasure of meeting and interacting with Eileen and Gary Beaman. They have been active within TBD for many years, contributing to TBD in different ways. Now, Eileen is, among other things, working on a voluntary basis, in the TBD office.

CLN: - Hi Eileen, Gary! Good to see that you are well. So, here's the first question: Where did you folks grow up?

Eileen: "- I grew up in Newark and Elizabeth, NJ, where all my family lived. I lived in Newark in a very diverse neighborhood of races and nationalities, which resulted in my growing up with zero prejudice.

Until I was 10, we lived in my grandmother's apartment with her my mother, father, brother, sister, aunt, uncle and two cousins – one bathroom for all of us – I don't remember it ever being a problem. We were happy listening to Yiddish

being spoken and enjoying all the holidays together.



I attended Morton Street Grammar school where my brother and I were in the minority of Caucasian children. When moving to Elizabeth, I attended Battin High School – an all-girl's public high school.

Gary: "- I grew up in Irvington, New Jersey with my mother, father and sister. I attended Irvington High School where he became proficient in woodworking and printing, which led to my career, as a printer.

CLN: From where did you get your Jewish education?

Eileen: "- I grew up in an orthodox kosher home where observances, traditions and Hebrew school were important. When we moved to Elizabeth we affiliated with a Conservative Synagogue.

Gary: " - I grew up in a Conservative kosher home also with traditions and attending Hebrew school to prepare for my Bar Mitzvah.

CLN: What did you work with, and what did you do?

Eileen: "- I worked for AT&T for 37 years. While working for one of the 4 vice presidents of the company, as an executive secretary, I was involved in the Divestiture of the Baby Bells, AT&T's entrance into the computer arena and active in the Annual Pebble Beach Pro-Am Golf Tournaments, of which AT&T is still a huge sponsor.

Gary: "-I was general foreman for a large printing company in Newark, NJ and subsequently started my own printing business.

CLN: When, and for what reason did you come to Florida?

"- In 2004, we came to Spring Hill, FL to visit our cousin and friends. They convinced us that it was a sellers' market, the right time to sell and there was a temple, nearby. Since we were retired, we made the move and have been here for 18 years".

CLN: When did you become a member of TBD?

"- We moved to Spring Hill in June of 2004 and joined TBD that October. The day we walked in to join, I was recruited to work on the Senior Lunch Program committee. That's when my volunteering began".

CLN: What do you feel that TBD has offered you, over the years?

"- A continued connection to our Jewishness and a place to feel at home".

CLN: What do you like best about TBD?

"-The camaraderie and commitment of its members and the joy of sharing holidays and simchas with our extended temple family".

CLN: What do you hope to contribute through your future involvement in TBD?

"- Time, volunteering and helping to sustain our existence in the community".

CLN: If you want to say something to someone who is interested in TBD, but is not yet a member – what would you say?

"- TBD is a welcoming and warm temple as exhibited by its members. If being a Jew is important to you and you want a connection to your Jewishness and to be with and meet people you have a commonality with, TBD is the place. You will never have to be alone during a holiday or simcha".






