## A message from the Rabbi

November, 2022.

Shalom Temple Beth David Friends,

It's hard to believe that November is just around the corner. Time flies by so quickly.

Recently we welcomed in the month of Cheshvan, which comes after the busyness of the fall holiday season. Cheshvan, is also known as Mar-Cheshvan. The



"mar" in Mar-cheshvan means "bitter". Think of the Passover Seder, we have "maror", the bitter herbs, that represent the bitterness of the time in Egypt.

So why is Cheshvan referred to as Mar-Cheshvan? Is there something sad or extremely difficult about this Hebrew month? Not necessarily. It is known as Mar-Cheshvan solely because it is the only month on the Jewish calendar in which no Jewish holiday falls. I don't think that's a bad thing. Sometimes we each really need downtime; to regroup, refocus, catch up on sleep or reading, redirect ourselves back to an unfinished project or a favorite hobby. Truly, this time can be a blessing for us.

An additional bonus of the month of Cheshvan is that it provides the gift of time for self-reflection. The lack of holidays offers plenty of time for us to make changes in ourselves. 

### Thanksgiving - something Jewish...?

### Dear Chai Lights Newsletter reader,

When I was trying to find a theme for the cover page of this edition of the Chai Lights Newsletter, I was wondering what I should look for. There are no Jewish holidays in November, at least, not around where I live....

So, I was googling around on the Internet, but nothing came to my mind.

Then I got a suggestion from Eileen Beaman, with whom I am in a regular contact with, when editing the CLN.

- "-Does it need to be a Jewish theme?" she asked me, when we had a short conversation, via email.
- "-What about Thanksgiving?"

### Of course!

I realized, that since we don't celebrate Thanksgiving over here in Sweden, even if we have a lot to be grateful for, that never struck me, since it doesn't belong to my traditions.

Thank you so much, Eileen!

And there seems to be a connection, between Judaism and Thanksgiving. At least for an amateur observer of American holidays, like me.

So, I made the cover page, and meanwhile, I started to wonder – what is this "Thanksgiving" all about?

Yes, of course, I know the typical oven baked turkey, filling the table, as well as filling the stomach of all participants, but really – what is the real history behind the holiday?

And now, the really interesting part, started to unfold.

So, when making the cover page, I, as I mentioned earlier, wondered if there were any connection between Thanksgiving and Judaism.

Being an editor for a Jewish newsletter, this thought slipped through my mind, sort of, automatically...

And after googling around, I got more than I wanted.

There seems to be some connections, and there are tons with articles for you to read, but one page I stumbled over, especially caught my interest.

**Rabbi Eric Eisencramer**, from Brunswick, NJ, has written a piece, which summarizes the story with the interesting parts, which might indicate a Jewish connection. You have a link in the end of the article. I have made shorter summary, below.

It all started – of course - with the Pilgrims.

When they celebrated their first Thanksgiving, most of them were "Puritans," which was a branch of the English protestant faith.

The Puritans wanted to eliminate all aspects of Catholicism from religious practices.

The Puritans strongly believed in the historical traditions and customs of the Israelites, in the bible.

The Puritans viewed their journey to America, as exact analogous to the exodus by the Israelites, from Egypt. The Red Sea was the Atlantic, and they were the Israelites, and America was their promised land.

Even more interesting, was the fact, that the Puritans often had biblical names, and they had proposed to make the Hebrew language as the language for the colonies (!)

However, the initial Thanksgiving celebration seemed to be far from a festive dinner. The puritans settlers in New England originally celebrated days of "thanksgiving" in prayers, thanking the Good Lord for various successes in the New World.

Many people believe that the Pilgrims modeled Thanksgiving after the holiday of Sukkot, as these harvest festivals both take place during the autumn. However, the practice of celebrating a good haul was popular throughout Europe long before the Mayflower touched down on Plymouth Rock. Native North Americans, like the Wampanoag, often held similar events come harvest time.

In Jewish tradition, Sukkot has a dual significance: historical and agricultural. We dwell in booths to remember how our ancestors lived in temporary shelters for 40 years, in the desertAs close readers of the Bible, the Puritans would have known about Sukkot which may have inspired them to celebrate Thanksgiving.

So far, about the Puritans, and the "mishpochology" of Thanksgiving and Sukkot...

If you want to read more about this connection, just google on the Internet.

Well, you should always be critical when someone presents something as "facts."

Could there really be any truth, in the connection between Thanksgiving and Judaism?


Dear CLN reader,




